







Role of Government?

Government will need to act, e.g.

- •We own / manage / regulate relevant assets or interests (transport, national parks, utilities networks)
- •Capacity to efficiently generate evidence on behalf of society as a whole (UKCP09, CCRA, Hadley Centre programme, etc.,)
- •imbalances of private and public risks and opportunities, or inter-generational market failures' (e.g. flood and coastal protection, building standards)
- ...need to ensure that this is not lost in the noise elsewhere in the economy



Prioritising – Risk Based Decisions The policy cycle (= Risk Cycle)

- We don't need to get everything right all at once, this time round (and we couldn't if we tried)
- Hence our 'clearing the brushwood' tests for Government engagement:
 - does it really matter?
 - does it really matter now?
 - does it really matter now to Government?
- Share ASC view that we are looking for 'low regrets' decisionmaking throughout the economy
- Defra see our job as 'taking adaptation/climate resilience into other people's rooms', **aka mainstreaming**

- · What decisions now, matter long term?

- Many of the risks and opportunities are for markets and commercial players to judge (which they do best)


Weather & climate impacts - economic, societal, environmental
